Introduction

The birth of the African Scientific Technical and Research Innovation Council, ASRIC, a continental research and development platform created by the AU was in sheer pursuit of a solid research driver for input generation feeding into the AU's new policies, strategies and plans for development of the region.

Article Types

Regular Articles

These should describe new and carefully confirmed findings, and experimental procedures should be given in sufficient details for others to verify the work. The length of the paper should be the minimum required to describe and interpret the work clearly.

Short Communications

A short Communication is suitable for recording the results of complete small investigations or giving details of new models or innovative methods or techniques. Short communications are 2 to 4 printed pages (6 to 12) manuscript pages in length.

Reviews

Submission of review and perspectives covering topics of current interest are welcome and encouraged. Review should be concise and no longer than 4 to 6 printed pages.

Publishing/Nature of Access

The ASRIC Scientific Journal, ASRIC-SJ will be an open access peerreviewed international platform where publishing of top quality, original and referred papers from highly intellectual scientists and researchers are to be received.



Preferences will be given to papers primarily based on their level of originality, contribution to knowledge among others.

Contributing authors can also submit the extended versions of previously published conference/ research papers.



Peer review selection procedure is used to select the papers for publication thus ensuring the uniqueness, relevance, and readability.







Mode of Operation/ Publishing Policies

Overall, the ASRIC Scientific Journal, ASRIC-SJ is modeled after SAGE Journals in its Peer review policy, Publishing Policies, Publication ethics etc.









Peer Review Policy

The ASRIC Scientific Journal, ASRIC-SJ will operate a strictly blinded peer review process in which the reviewer's name is withheld from the author and the author's name from the reviewer.

The reviewer may at their own discretion opt to reveal their name to the author in their review but the standard policy practice is for both identities to remain concealed.

Decisions on manuscripts will be taken as rapidly as possible.

Authorship

All parties who have made a substantive contribution to the article should be listed as authors.

Principal authorship, authorship order, and other publication credits should be based on the relative scientific or professional contributions of the individuals involved, regardless of their status.



For example, a student is usually listed as principal author on any multiple authored publication that substantially derives from the student's dissertation or thesis.







Acknowledgements

All contributors who do not meet the criteria for authorship should be listed in an Acknowledgements section.

Examples of those who might be acknowledged include a person who provided purely technical help, or a department chair who provided only general support









Acknowledgements

Writing assistance Individuals who provided writing assistance, e.g. from a specialist communciations company, do not qualify as authors and so should be included in the Acknowledgements section.

Authors must disclose any writing assistance — including the individual's name, company and level of input — and identify the entity that paid for this assistance"). It is not necessary to disclose use of language polishing services.









Publication Ethics

The ASRIC Scientific Journal, ASRIC-SJ will be committed to upholding the integrity of the academic record.

We will encourage authors to refer to the Committee on Publication Ethics' International Standards for Authors and view the Publication Ethics page on the SAGE Author Gateway





Plagiarism

The ASRIC Scientific Journal, ASRIC-SJ will take issues of copyright infringement, plagiarism or other breaches of best practice in publication very seriously.



We seek to protect the rights of our authors and we always investigate claims of plagiarism or misuse of articles published in the journal.

Equally, we seek to protect the reputation of the journal against malpractice.









Plagiarism

Submitted articles may be checked using duplication checking software.

Where an article is found to have plagiarised other work or included third party copyright material without permission or with insufficient acknowledgement, or where authorship of the article is contested, we reserve the right to take due action









Open Access and Author Archiving Policy

The ASRIC Scientific Journal, ASRIC-SJ will offer optional open access.

It is proposed to be hosted in Sabinet and other open access journals hosts.



We shall consider the Gold open access where Sabinet offers an immediate open access option which allows journals to make the final published version of their journal issue freely available online. See info@sabinet.co.za





Preparation of Copy

The ASRIC Scientific Journal, ASRIC-SJ will be a peer reviewed publication. Articles between 4000-7000 words (double spaced pages) including tables, notes and references, are accepted for review.

The Editors reserve the right to return papers to authors where they exceed this word limit. Submission of a manuscript to another journal while under review by the Journal of Sociology is unethical.









Preparation of Copy

Breach of this principle will result in the paper being removed from consideration for publication in the JOS.

Each manuscript must be accompanied by a signed statement that it has not been published previously and that it has not and will not be sent for consideration by another journal while submitted to the ASRIC Scientific Journal, ASRIC-SJ.









Funding/Publication Charges

By its nature as AU agency publication, the ASRIC Scientific Journal, ASRIC-SJ is proposed to be funded by the AU mobilized funds.

Therefore an author can submit a Research Paper for review freely and published afterward freely as well.

However, the following guidelines should be adhered to in the process of submission.



All the submitting authors of the paper will get individual soft copy of certificate.

Registration of all the authors.
